MISK ART INSTITUTE'S GROUND-BREAKING 'KSA/LAX' EXHIBITION BRINGS SAUDI ARTISTS TO LA ART DISTRICT DURING CROWN PRINCE'S VISIT

- Saudi and American artists to collaborate on live performance art
- Features a range of traditional and hi-tech art forms, including paint, VR and animation
- Focuses on inter-cultural dialogue and building relationships international art institutions

Los Angeles, CA, (03 April 2018) - Following its well-received art events in Washington D.C. and New York City, the Misk Art Institute continues its program of activity during the Crown Prince of Saudi Arabia's US visit with a dynamic exhibition in Los Angeles.

The Institute, part of the Misk Foundation, the non-profit youth empowerment foundation established by H.R.H. Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, is proud to present KSA/LAX – a one-day exhibition and event in the heart of the LA cultural scene in Arts District Los Angeles, at 7.00pm, Wednesday 4 April. KSA/LAX will feature a selection of Saudi Arabia's most vital young artists presenting their work and, uniquely, collaborating with local US artists for live performance art.

KSA/LAX will take place in a warehouse at 820 Sante Fe Avenue, Downtown Los Angeles Arts District, where media and the public are invited to enjoy an immersive exhibition of large scale paintings, live performances and animated projections, virtual reality and video by a new generation of Saudi artists and designers. The event will offer a unique perspective on ancient art forms, exploring traditional themes and aesthetics in a 21st century context.

Several female Saudi artists are participating, including Noha Khashoggi, co-founder of Tahreek Studio, a motion graphics house in Dubai. Her artistic focus is the intersection of culture and language. Another artist exhibiting their work is Jeddah-born abstract artist Abdullah Qandeel, who uses bold line and color to illustrate the coalescing of Saudi traditional norms and the vastly changing cultural landscape of the Arab world.

Another key aspect of Misk Art Institute's activity in the US during the Crown Prince's tour is building relationships with international arts institutions. Their events have taken place in the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington D.C., and Phillips New York.

Misk Art Institute is led by renowned Saudi artist Ahmed Mater, who said: "So far, during the Crown Prince's US visit we have presented the rich seam of Saudi artistic talent to our American friends, showing that a new generation of artists is helping create a vibrant society in Saudi Arabia."

He continued, "the Misk Art Institute, like the Misk Foundation more generally, works to empower young Saudis by helping them to unleash their creative abilities. We do this at home, but as you can see here in Los Angeles, and throughout the States, we do it by encouraging collaboration between artists from our two countries. We use the universal language of art to boost cross-cultural exchange and we are building relationships across America with artists and leading art institutions. These relationships will persist into the future, helping bring our two peoples together

and in so doing, dispelling stereotypes about Saudi Arabia. We are telling the continuing, exciting story of change sweeping across the Kingdom".

Artist Abdullah Qandeel said, "It's great to be taking part in KSA/LAX and to have the opportunity to collaborate with our American artist friends. I welcome the debate that flows from my art. I invite you to observe, feel and absorb the development of the new Arab culture, the revival of a new generation where investigation replaces revelation."
